		<u>Cleaning</u> Thorough cleaning of the centre at the end of the day.	Rigorous checks will be carried out by line managers to ensure that the necessary procedures are being followed.
		Symptoms of Covid-19 If anyone becomes unwell with a new continuous cough or a high temperature in the workplace they will be sent home and advised	Line managers will offer support to staff who are affected by Coronavirus or has a family member affected.

 to follow the stay at home guidance as well as seeking an immediate test. Line managers will maintain regular contact with staff members during this time. If advised that a member of staff, student, or member of the public has developed Covid-19 and were recently on our premises the management team of the workplace will contact the Public Health Authority to discuss the case, identify people who have been in contact with them and will take advice on any actions or precautions that should be taken. 	
Lateral Flow testing All staff and students will be tested for COVID-19 twice weekly using a home testing kit (lateral flow system). If anyone has a positive test result they will not be permitted to attend the centre and should follow current government guidance. Close contacts of this person will also be advised to follow current government guidance on self isolation.	COVID testing team leaders (CT and FK)
